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RSRC 2nd Annual "Black History Month" Research Writing Contest

Inspired by then Carman-Ainsworth High School student Randi Richardson in 2014, this research-writing contest encourages participants to explore and gain a better understanding of the contributions African Americans made (and continue to make) to the history of the United States of America.

The research writing must be typed in 12 pt. fonts, have proper margins, be single-spaced and use Times New Roman. A title page/cover page and a reference page must be included. The research writing must feature a subject related to a Black History person/figures (*defined as a person of Black African descent*) that helped shape and mold American history. Students, grades 5th through 12th, writings should be no longer than 750 words. The research writing should report on the below questions (as many as possible).

The Person: Where were they born? What was their educational training? What were some of their childhood experiences? Who were their parents? What was their contribution to U.S History? Why is their contribution important? What was/is their life views? Who were their mentors/mentees? What are several ideas they promoted?

Your Personal Insight: What about this person caught your attention? How does their contribution benefit you? What 10 words would you say to this person? What did you learn about yourself from this writing?

All participants must be enrolled in Carman-Ainsworth Schools. For each school building in the district, there will be first (\$50), second (\$30) and third (\$20) place winners and cash awards. The deadline for entries is **Monday, March 12, 2018**. Winners will be announced and contacted Monday March 19, 2018.
